

If your child is in year 5 and you would like them to attend the residential trip in October, please return your forms to indicate your interest by next week. If you require further information, please speak to Miss Naisby.



EARLY YEARS

Nursery

Over the next two weeks the children will be learning about the traditional tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. The role play areas are set up as a construction site and we will be looking into the materials required for building a good strong house. The Three Little Pigs story teaches the children about



determination, bravery and the importance of working as a team.

Reception

This week in Reception we have been learning about Three Billy Goats Gruff. We have enjoyed listening to the story, we have looked at structures of bridges and sequenced the pictures of the story. On the creative table we have used different 3D materials to make scary trolls and goats. We had

KEY STAGE 1

Year 1

Year 1 children have had a marvellous week back after the Christmas break. They began by listening to a story all about a man on the moon. In maths, the children were given lots of opportunities to master their ability to use different strategies for adding and calculating number bonds to 20. They used representations of ten frames, bead strings and number lines to explain different methods for adding number up to 20.



This week we have started our new maths topic of money! We have enjoyed exploring different coin and note values as well as making different amounts. We have also begun exploring the life of Florence Nightingale and the work she did to reform nursing.


Year 2

Year 3


Year 3 children have all settled in well and all the children have been fully engaged in our new scheme of work.

They have enjoyed the introduction of our new English book, Escape from Pompeii and its link to Romans, being covered in our History lessons.



Year 4

Year 4 children have settled back well and have had an exciting week learning about our digestive system and how food travels through our body. We have learnt about the five main components of our digestive system and are now beginning to write our own explanation texts. We have enjoyed starting to read the




hilarious book, 'Kay's Anatomy,' a guide to the human body.

UPPER KEY STAGE 2

Year 5

This week, we have been adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers. In English, we have started reading our new book Who Let The Gods Out? by Maz Evans, closely exploring the author's style of writing and making predictions about the book. This links closely to our history topic, Ancient Greece. In science, we are studying the properties and changes of materials. The children compared and grouped materials according to whether they were solids, liquids, or gases, and named their properties.



Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been converting between metric units of measure in maths. In English, we started reading our class book 'Secrets of a Sun King' by Emma Carroll, which is linked to our history topic of Ancient Egypt. The children enjoyed using their imagination to write a letter based on a package one of the characters received. In history, the children have been learning about the different job roles during Ancient Egyptian times. We have also started to draw our own pyramids in art concentrating on shading.
